



The Amage of God

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. -Genesis 1:27



22 Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. **23** For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. **24** Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

25 Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, 26 that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, 27 so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. 28 In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. 29 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, 30 because we are members of his body. 31 "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32 This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. 33 However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

Love

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her,

 $-\mathcal{E}ph.5:25$

- Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered. -1 Peter 3:7
 • Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the
- discipline and instruction of the Lord.-Ephesians 6:4
- And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. -Deut. 6:6-7
- In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. -Eph. 5:28

Protect

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her,

- **Rescue** the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked -Psalm 82:4

- When a **strong** man, **fully armed**, **guards** his own palace, his goods are safe;-Luke 11:21

Marks of a Thriving Wife.

- 10 An excellent wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels.
- 11 The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain.
- 12 She does him good, and not harm, all the days of her life.
- 13 She seeks wool and flax, and works with willing hands.
- 14 She is like the ships of the merchant; she brings her food from afar.
- 15 She rises while it is yet night and provides food for her household and portions for her maidens.
- 16 She considers a field and buys it; with the fruit of her hands she plants a vineyard.
- 17 She dresses herself with strength and makes her arms strong.
- 18 She perceives that her merchandise is profitable. Her lamp does not go out at night.
- 19 She puts her hands to the distaff, and her hands hold the spindle.
- 20 She opens her hand to the poor and reaches out her hands to the needy.

- 21 She is not afraid of snow for her household, for all her household are clothed in scarlet.
- 22 She makes bed coverings for herself; her clothing is fine linen and purple.
- 23 Her husband is known in the gates when he sits among the elders of the land.
- 24 She makes linen garments and sells them; she delivers sashes to the merchant.
- 25 Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come.
- 26 She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue.
- 27 She looks well to the ways of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness.
- 28 Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her:
- 29 "Many women have done excellently, but you surpass them all."
- 30 Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.
- 31 Give her of the fruit of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates.

Commands for the Wife

- Likewise, wives, be subject to your own husbands, so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives, when they see your respectful and pure conduct. 3 Do not let your adorning be external—the braiding of hair and the putting on of gold jewelry, or the clothing you wear— 4 but let your adorning be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious. 5 For this is how the holy women who hoped in God used to adorn themselves, by submitting to their own husbands, 6 as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord. And you are her children, if you do good and do not fear anything that is frightening. -1 Peter 3:1-6
- I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. -1 Timothy 2:12
- Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good, and so train the young women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled. -Titus 2:3-5

- Adorn with a gentle and quiet spirit. (1 Peter 3:1-6)

But I want you to understand that Christ is the head of every man, and the man is the head of a woman, and God is the head of Christ. -1 Cor. 11:3



Father Rule

Patriarchy: pa·tri·arch·y patriarkhēs = 'ruling father'

(noun): a system of society or government in which the father or eldest male is head of the family and descent is traced through the male line.

Mother Rule.

Woman is head of the home and is the primary authority and decision-maker. This usually spills over into leadership outside the home. Men in this scenario are often absent or weak.

No Rule.

Man and woman are equal in authority, and there is no distinction of function between them in the home or outside the home.

This often leads to confusion and conflict in functions.

Different but Equal.


Men and women are equal in value but distinct in their roles. Complementarianism often fails to specify but usually holds to male leadership in the home but not usually outside the home.

Father Rule.

Men and women are equal in value, but men are to lead, provide, and protect both in the home and outside the home, as wive run the home and support their husbands.

Biblical Headship

- Biblically, the head represents power, authority, and honor. Kings and priests would be anointed and crowned on the head. (1 Sam 10:1, 2 Sam 1:10, 2 Kings 9:3, Psalm 21:3)
- The Septuagint uses kephale (head) to refer to an elderly person, a prominent leader, a king, or someone in authority.
- Paul Uses headship to refer to "authority" (Eph. 5:21-25, Col 1:18, Colossians 2:10, Colossians 2:19, 1 Cor. 11:5-6)



Patriarchy Not Chauvinism

- Chauvinism is household tyranny. It occurs when the husband/father leverages his authority for selfish gain.
- Biblical Patriarchy occurs when the husband/father wields his authority for the wellbeing of his household.

Marriage, Headship, and the Household

Marriage is sacred for many reasons (Genesis 2:24, Hebrews 13:4).

However, it is particularly important because it is God's method for building His Kingdom from generation to generation. So many of God's commands are built around the home to ensure that the faith is passed down from generation to generation (Deuteronomy 6).

It gives God glory in the simplest of functions as husband and wife and children serve one another in loving fulfillment of the Law (Romans 13:8-13). This is why disruption of marriage is not a small matter. It derails the generational propagation of the Kingdom with untold effects.



Marriage, Headship, and the Household

- "For the man who does not love his wife but divorces her, says the Lord, the God of Israel, covers his garment with violence, says the Lord of hosts. So guard yourselves in your spirit, and do not be faithless."-Malachi 2:16
- But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. -1 Timothy 5:8
- Let your fountain be blessed, And rejoice in the wife of your youth. -Prov. 5:18
- Do not deprive one another, except perhaps by agreement for a limited time, that you may devote yourselves to prayer; but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control.-1 Cor. 7:5

Patriarchy Requires Manliness

- Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love. -1 Cor. 16:13-14
- "... Be strong, and show yourself a man, and keep the charge of the Lord your God, walking in his ways and keeping his statutes, his commandments, his rules, and his testimonies, as it is written in the Law of Moses, that you may prosper in all that you do and wherever you turn..." -1 Kings 2:2-4
- Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; ... -Psalm 1:1-6
- For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God; -1 Thessalonians 4:3-5
- It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? -Heb. 12:7

Men Are Commanded to Be Men

9 Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, **10** nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. **11** And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. **-1** Cor. 6:9-10

μαλακοὶ **Strong's:** 3120 Transliterated: malakoi Condemns "softness" 1) soft, soft to the touch 2) effeminate

Patriarchy and Church Governance: Elders and Deacons Must Be Faithful Husbands/Father.

Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, soberminded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, 3 not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. 4 He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, 5 for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? 6 He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. 7 Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.

8 Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. 9 They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. 10 And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. 11 Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. 12 Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. 13 For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.-1 Timothy 3:2-7

Patriarchy and Civil Authority: Elders and Deacons Must Be Faithful Husbands/Father.

- "He must not take many wives, or his heart will be led astray" (Deuteronomy 17:17)
- "He must not accumulate large amounts of silver and gold" (Deuteronomy 17:17)
- "When he takes the throne of his kingdom, he is to write for himself on a scroll a copy of this law, taken from that of the priests, who are Levites. It is to be with him, and he is to read it all the days of his life so that he may learn to revere the Lord his God and follow carefully all the words of this law and these decrees" (Deuteronomy 17:18–19)
- The king must "not consider himself better than his brothers and turn from the law to the right or to the left" (Deuteronomy 17:20).







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

Arguments Against Patriarchy

"Headship is the result of the fall, not God's design." (see Gen. 3:16)

"Patriarchy leads to abuse." (chauvenism)

RESPONSE

That wouldn't change the fact that God has commanded it, but this is a false argument anyway. Headship is part of the created order. (1 Timothy 2:13).

Egalitarianism has also lead to abuse. None of this changes the fact that we are to obey God. Notably, patriarchy practiced properly punishes abuse. Egalitarianism makes no such provision. A system without patriarchs is a system without men to punish evil.
